



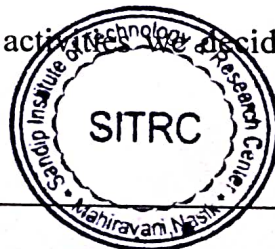
#### **Objective:**
